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LOCATION

Enjoy a privileged location. The UMH is located in southeast Spain and has a climate that offers up to 9 months of warm temperatures and sunny skies.

The municipality of Elche has 9 kilometers of coastline and is located centrally relative to the main beaches in the north and south of the province of Alicante.



Discover amazing historical and cultural heritage. The city of Elche, home to the main UMH campus, is the only Spanish city with three World Heritage Sites in different categories. Less than 40 kilometers from Elche is the historic center of the city of Orihuela, which offers significant architectural heritage, highlighting its importance as a university and church headquarters.

WELCOME

The Miguel Hernández University of Elche (UMH) is a Spanish public university located in the province of Alicante. Established in 1996, its name commemorates the renowned Spanish poet Miguel Hernández. The UMH has the mission of serving society by providing quality education, research, and services, facilitating the comprehensive development of its students and their insertion into the workplace.

The UMH offers 26 bachelor's, 49 master's and 13 PhD programs adapted to the European Higher Education Area in the fields of the arts, experimental and technical sciences, engineering, and health and social sciences. These activities are carried out at four campuses strategically located in the Province of Alicante: Elche (main campus), Orihuela, Sant Joan d'Alacant, and Altea.

The UMH is particularly concerned about its students' labor market insertion. Here, the university has excelled thanks to more than 10,800 collaboration agreements signed with businesses and institutions, which have facilitated internships for more than 10,400 students during 2016.

Moreover, in recent years, the UMH has made significant efforts to promote educational innovation through the incorporation of technology into the learning process. As a result, the UMH YouTube channel (<http://youtube.umh.es>) holds first position in the number of videos offered and is second in the number of reproductions among Spanish universities. In addition, the UMH currently offers a wide choice of MOOCs on the umhX platform. All of these resources make it extraordinarily easy for incoming students facing language barriers to follow classes at the beginning of their stay at our university.

The UMH has also fostered partnerships with other national and international institutions to promote student mobility and attract foreign students. In all, the UMH has signed 371 bilateral ERASMUS agreements, 73 non-ERASMUS agreements, and more

than 350 agreements with 49 Spanish universities. In its bid for its internationalization, the UMH has set in motion a complete program of activities to facilitate foreign academic stays and to receive students who wish to further their education within our classrooms.

Quality research characterizes the UMH, as shown by a study carried out by the Observatory of Research Activities at Spanish Universities (IUNE) on research productivity by Spanish universities, which places the UMH within the top ten universities for 2017 in terms of annual scientific production and citations per faculty member.

Moreover, the renowned U-Ranking (2017), published by the BBVA Foundation and the Valencian Institute for Economic Research (IVIE), places the UMH in the fifth position in terms of its overall productivity.

We welcome you to the UMH, fully confident that our university not only trains good professionals, but also comprehensively educates our students in pluralistic and tolerant thinking and collaborates in finding solutions to the problems affecting society.

The Occupational Observatory mission is to increase the level of employability for students and graduates through tools such as internships, job placement, training courses on professional skills, and information on labor market dynamics, personalized counseling and promotion of entrepreneurship. Its main functions are:

Management of students' internships at companies and institutions.

Promotion of university and industry relationships through educational cooperation agreements, a jobs bank, and job day events.

Organization of activities to facilitate the search for employment and support students in actively seeking their first job.

Encouragement of entrepreneurship by training, informing and advising students on entrepreneurship and handling the presentation of their business plans, through prizes and contests.

FACULTY OF SOCIAL AND LEGAL SCIENCES OF ELCHE

The Faculty of Social and Legal Sciences of Elche is a prominent unit within the Miguel Hernández University, due both to the number of students who opt to learn within its classrooms and the variety of training offered. With over 3,300 students, the faculty offers undergraduate programs in Business Administration, Law, Business Statistics, Journalism, Labor Relations and Human Resources, and Audiovisual Communication. In addition to these programs, the Faculty offers numerous official master's programs fully adapted to the requirements of the European Higher Education Area for completing education whose sole objective is the professional development of students to thereby ensure a more stable professional future for them.

The Faculty of Social and Legal Sciences of Elche is located within an oasis of palm trees, where culture and tradition are combined with modern facilities and a communications system that provides good accessibility. Its instructors offer theoretical and experimental training that allows their students to acquire practical and analytical skills, facilitating their labor market insertion.

Beyond the classrooms, the faculty vigorously encourages taking on activities that complement academic training, as shown by the more than 1,000 internships at companies and institutions completed by its students during the academic year. Furthermore, it organizes activities in collaboration with the Student Delegation, such as visits to businesses and institutions related to the degree programs taught, job days (in collaboration with the Occupational Observatory), internationalization days (jointly with the Vice Rectorate for International Relations), and a large number of specific activities for each program, guaranteeing continuous adaptation of the skills of students to the growing needs of today's society.

BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT

The main objective of the business program is to train professionals and make them able to navigate the complex and dynamic world of business.

Students will become able to successfully undertake the various functions involved in business administration and management, and they may, if they wish, carry out internships at businesses and institutions during the program's first year.

This way, our graduates will contribute to the proper operation and improvement of results at organizations, all while incorporating ethical values into their activities, fully aware of their social function.

Students may carry out Erasmus exchanges at over 30 universities in 11 countries of the EU and European Economic Area. Likewise, they can carry out exchanges at 20 Spanish universities, as well as academic stays in Ibero-America and industrial internships in Japan.

Incoming students receive assistance to adapt to Spanish academic and social life in aspects such as moving around campus, finding accommodations, integrating into the city's vibrant college atmosphere, Spanish culture, and society, eventually becoming a part of it.



Keys to training:

Small groups, allowing instructors to provide personalized attention.

Internships beginning the first academic year at over 10,800 collaborating businesses.

According to the latest reports in labor insertion from the Occupation Observatory, 89.7% of business graduates have found employment.

Affords the possibility of furthering education in various master's programs, notably the Master's in Business Administration and Management.

Infrastructure and support services for entrepreneurship and innovation at the UMH Scientific & Business Park and Nau de la Innovació.

Free access to modern computer laboratories for personal use or working on course assignments.

Access to study rooms (some open 24 hours a day) and spaces for completing group work, reading, or simply chatting with classmates without the need to remain silent like in the library.

Notable seminars and training activities:

Job days, bringing together the School of Economists of Alicante, employers, graduates, and students, along with the jobs weekend to discover what businesses are seeking and how to improve the candidacy of students.

Internationalization days that facilitate undertaking studies and internships abroad.

The Business Creation Marathon allows students to accelerate innovative ideas, combining very practical training on the creation and management of startups with personalized advice, workspaces, and financing.



BUSINESS STATISTICS

The Bachelor's in Business Statistics has the objective of training skilled professionals in applying the methods and models of statistics and operations research in productive organizations, as well as for undertaking a large number of specific tasks which accompany any data analysis process, which often is a first step in preparing for decision making in complex situations characterized by being subject to different degrees of uncertainty.

The expansion of the digital economy, based on information technology and mass availability of information on products, services, and clients, has greatly increased the demand for these skills in the labor market. In fact, business statistics was the program with the highest employment rate in Spain in 2016, far better than other traditional programs.

Our graduates are able to make tactical and strategic decisions related with different functional areas of business. They are also able to perceive the nature of problems and interpret solutions provided by corresponding models.

Likewise, they are able to communicate results, conclusions from models, and propose solutions in a way that is comprehensible to everybody else in the business or organization, enabling them to be accepted and implemented by those in charge of decision making.

Keys to training:

Training for managing large data sets with sophisticated computing tools.

Training for handling information stored in databases, programming algorithms, and using specialized software for statistics and operations research.

Close connection with an excellent research institute, the UMH Center of Operations Research (CIO), which provides access to innovative infrastructure and personnel on an international level.

SABIA.net project, which facilitates internships in other countries, combining learning with completing the final degree project and student mobility

Notable seminars and training activities:

Internationalization days that facilitate learning and internships abroad.

Job days held along with the Occupational Observatory, through which former program students present the large variety of professional opportunities afforded by the program. It is also employed to bring businesses to the university.

Ongoing access to workshops days and seminars organized by the Center of Operations Research (CIO).

LAW

The Bachelor's in Law provides excellent training, preparing students for efficiently undertaking a wide range of civic and professional functions and activities. It is taught in a learning environment in which critical and innovative thinking is always encouraged for personal and social development.

This program can currently be taken in the classroom or via blended-format instruction. It strongly encourages national and international mobility of students through numerous exchange programs with other universities (Erasmus+ studies and internships, Leonardo, Sicue, Destino, and Vulcanus) and agreements with businesses. There are currently 69 mobility agreements with foreign universities for both its students and instructors. Because of this focus on the internationalization of the program, the proportion of total students participating in international mobility programs has increased year after year, and currently greatly exceeds standards.

Keys to training:

Classroom and blended formats. The advanced tools of the Miguel Hernández University, as well as the commitment of its instructors, facilitate work for effective implementation of the blended format.

The UMH Law Clinic allows students, mentored by program instructors, to provide legal advice to non-profit entities that request it, within the framework of their end of program Final Degree Project.

Possibility of continuing education in graduate programs, with a choice of 12 master's closely related with the job prospects of a law graduate.

Close relationship with the Illustrious Bar Association of Elche (ICAE), whose main activity is joint coordination between Law professors and the ICAE Master's in Law.

Internships in relevant bodies of government, such as the Consell Jurídic Consultiu of the Valencian Community, 11 city councils, courts within the province, local police headquarters of Elche, and the Regional Council.

Access to scientific journals promoted by program instructors, such as the recent launch of the Lex Mercatoria magazine, with a clear orientation towards legal practice.

Notable seminars and training activities.

Ongoing Seminar on Current Legal Issues, an annual cycle of conferences in which faculty and professionals of renowned prestige analyze issues of a legal nature.

The UMH Ongoing Workshop on Public Speaking and Debate (TOD), an activity that offers our students continuous quality training on public speaking and debate.

DUAL BACHELOR'S IN LAW AND BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT

Upon completion of the 366 credits in this five-year program, two undergraduate degrees are conferred: the Bachelor's in Law in addition to the Bachelor's in Business Administration and Management.

The objective of this dual program is to educate versatile professionals capable of working effectively in both the legal and business fields through comprehensive training that always encourages critical and innovative thinking.

Keys to training:

Combining two highly complementary academic specialties (law with business administration and management) affords students extra value for their entry into the labor market.

This program provides excellent career opportunities. In addition to the professional opportunities of both programs, law & business administration and management, there are additional specific opportunities for graduates of this dual program, because they are highly trained to take on roles with the highest level of responsibility.

Internships at businesses, labor exchanges, and training in professional skills and competencies through the UMH Occupational Observatory.

Program training is completed with the national and international mobility of students through numerous exchange programs with other universities (Erasmus Program/Séneca, Leonardo, Sicue, etc.) and agreements with multiple companies

Notable seminars and training activities:

Work days, courses, and workshops organized by the UMH Occupational Observatory to provide students with access to employment, advising them on issues such as preparation for job interviews, job seeking, internships abroad, and entrepreneurial motivation.

Internationalization days to facilitate studying and internships abroad.

Ongoing Seminar on Current Legal Issues: an annual cycle of conferences in which instructors and professionals of renowned prestige analyze issues of a legal nature. This activity has the collaboration from the Illustrious Bar Association, the Illustrious Association of Attorneys of Elche, and each edition is sponsored by different professional offices, allowing the seminar to have a markedly practical vision.

AUDIOVISUAL COMMUNICATION

The Bachelor's in Audiovisual Communication program trains future professionals in direction, production, management, scripting, television, digital and radio programming, equipment operation, production design, art direction, casting direction, photography and photographic direction, editing, camera, sound, special effects, storyboard design and animation, among other professions.

The focus encompasses cinematic, television, video, advertising, radio, and multimedia fields with a special interest in the competitive training of graduates.

We provide training on skills and abilities for entering these professions, undertaking cross-disciplinary work, directly related with the business sector, providing this program with an appropriate work routine, adapted to the working reality at all times.

We are committed to the exchange of knowledge and experiences, offering a wide range of national and international mobility agreements, as well as itinerant projects for filming documentaries and short films with foreign work teams, all connecting the university and business.

The faculty have been trained by professionals linked with the audiovisual market, bringing experience and current practices to the classroom so that students complete their training with a portfolio that endorses them for various works such as short films, documentaries, music videos, cross-media advertising campaigns, web projects, publishing magazines, reports for television, radio programs, etc.

Keys to training:

JOURNALISM

The UMH Bachelor's in Journalism offers a dynamic and rigorous training plan linked with professional practice, and is endorsed by its position within the top five undergraduate program in journalism in Spain (U-Ranking, 2017).

Practical training of students is carried out in facilities with computer equipment, a television studio, and radio studios.

In journalism, we are committed to national and international mobility. Each year around 80 places are offered for mobility to national and international destinations.

Among the foreign universities with an agreement with the journalism program are institutions in Germany, France, Croatia, Italy, Latvia, Poland, Turkey, Portugal, Mexico, and the United States.

Keys to training:

The UMH Bachelor's in Journalism combines practical courses in written, digital, radio, and television journalism with theoretical material on communication and the arts.

Learning is facilitated through classes and workshops in small groups to create journalistic content in various dissemination channels.



Journalism training at the UMH can be furthered with the Master's in Innovation in Journalism and the Doctoral Program in Social and Legal Sciences.

The journalism program offers students the opportunity to carry out internships at local and national businesses and media organizations.

Its instructors include journalists and entrepreneurs who present experiences and innovative tools for professional practice in their classes.

Students can collaborate in cutting-edge research on innovation in journalism and participate in workdays and seminars with teachers and external speakers.

Students can participate on teams that create UMH Radio programming with unique formats and broadcasting in the province of Alicante.

Notable seminars and training activities:

International journalism workdays: this event reunites prestigious professionals to speak to students about the challenges of the profession in a casual setting.


The Ryszard Kapuscinski International Seminar is a meeting with international journalists and humanists to encourage dialog and reflection on global conflicts.

The Ricardo Ortega Journalistic Reporting Competition is an annual event that recognizes the best reports UMH journalism students produce in their classes.

Workdays: seminar for students with UMH journalism graduates, professionals, and experts on the most sought-after professional profiles in the sector.

Journalists' forum: meetings with professionals in practical classes, open to the rest of the university community in order to present the profession up close.

REC Radio and *Reporteros en el Campus*: a group of students collaborates annually in the creation of a UMH Radio program and a magazine for the program.



LABOR RELATIONS AND HUMAN RESOURCES

The Bachelor's in Labor Relations and Human Resources at the Miguel Hernández University of Elche trains expert professionals in the organization of work from a cross-disciplinary perspective. It is the essential basis of experts and professionals in labor and human resource management.

Its multidisciplinary nature enables high employability that encompasses both representation before the government, labor inspectorate, labor mediation, immigration departments, social jurisdiction, and in education. In addition to these, there are possibilities within businesses for comprehensive management, encompassing issues such as prevention, social and labor audits, and human resource management.

This program has agreements for student exchanges with universities in Germany, France, Italy, and Portugal, among others.

Keys to training:

Teaching is provided by professionals in the private and public spheres who bring their experience to their respective activities.

The program has student advisors available to assist those who may be working and therefore unable to attend classes to help them keep up with coursework.

Due to its multidisciplinary nature, it provides access to various master's programs, such as Occupational Risk Prevention, Taxation, Advanced Accounting and Finance; Human Resources Management, Work and Organizations; and Business Administration and Management.

A wide range of internships in both the private and public sectors in addition to the justice system.

Close collaboration with the Official Association of Labor Relations Specialists, allowing pre-membership for free starting the program's third year.

MASTERS

LAW

(90 ECTS; 2 academic years)

The Master's in Law program provides specific training for practicing law. The especially qualified professional training that this program provides is a central element and an essential requirement for working professionally as a lawyer.

Practical vocational training is the main objective of this program. This training supplements the undergraduate law degree and ensures the student's ability to provide the legal assistance set forth in the Spanish Constitution

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BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT

(60 ECTS; 1 academic year)

The essence of this MBA lies in its universal and generic orientation. It does not focus on one certain aspect of organizations nor is it aimed at any particular sector. Instead, it strives to provide its students with additional training in aspects concerning the creation and management of organizations, which is useful and practical for successfully finding a job regardless of the degree held by its students or the technical knowledge they possess.

This program also opens a window for understanding and assimilating the entrepreneurial and proactive outlook that will create growth opportunities whether working for oneself or others.

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INNOVATION IN JOURNALISM

(60 ECTS; 1 academic year)

The Master's in Innovation in Journalism helps the student master the keys and techniques of the most innovative journalism. This training program can be taken in an online or blended format over one year that presents conceptual classes and practical workshops taught by some of the most innovative media professionals in Spanish journalism.

Its learning method offers the student the opportunity to design, plan, and develop an entrepreneurial journalistic project throughout the program, which materializes in the Final Master's Project. Thus, this program is oriented towards professional practice by working on exercises and cases for learning to navigate journalistic information, new narratives, web analysis, and community management of social networks

The master's faculty includes journalists, creators, founders, and leaders of the most innovative media in Spain: El Confidencial, eldiario.es, Weblogs, Verne, Podium Podcast, El Desmarque, 93 metros, vis-à-vis, and RTVE Lab, among others. Its practical focus helps the student learn working methods such as design thinking and lean startup, generate ideas, and develop journalistic products more effectively.

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SOCIAL PRACTICE ANTHROPOLOGY

(60 ECTS; 1 academic year)

The challenges of today's world and society require answers from the social sciences and from social anthropology.

The Master's in Social Practice Anthropology specifically addresses issues such as confronting crises with local strategies, migration and intercultural relations and coexistence, transculturality in all areas, the consequences of globalization and ways to address them, prioritizing development and its effectiveness, promoting heritage and its relationship with tourism in various ways, the process of contemporary globalization, and the development and expansion of capitalism.

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TAXATION

(60 ECTS; 1 academic year)

The Master's in Taxation program aims primarily to train highly qualified professionals in the field of tax advisory and consulting, and provides them with significant theoretical and practical knowledge that enables them to access a rapidly expanding labor market under the best conditions and with the greatest chances for success. Its instruction aims to provide the profile of specialization required by the tax advisory profession, providing advanced, comprehensive, practical, and specialized training in the substantive and procedural aspects of tax consulting, from both a domestic as well as an international perspective.

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ADVANCED ACCOUNTING AND FINANCE

(60 ECTS; 1 academic year)

The program presented trains students on the latest business techniques related to accounting and finance, consistent with the tendencies and experiences of European benchmark countries. In addition, the program aims to prepare students to correctly interpret, transmit, and utilize the large quantities of economic information produced today. The Master's in Advanced Accounting and Finance curriculum includes all the theoretical and practical training the student needs in order to apply its competencies.

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CRIME ANALYSIS AND PREVENTION

(60 ECTS; 1 academic year)

The Master's in Crime Analysis and Prevention is the official online master's degree in criminology. Unique to Spain and Latin America, it is designed to train professional experts in crime analysis and prevention. The program is intended for university students seeking training and specialization in security and criminology, individuals with undergraduate degrees wishing to pursue doctoral-level education, law enforcement authorities, public and private security directors and consultants, policy makers and technicians in public and private bodies, whether national or international, as well as others with an interest in these disciplines

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RESEARCH IN NEW ANTHROPOLOGY TRENDS: RISK SCENARIOS AND POST-DEVELOPMENT ALTERNATIVES

(60 ECTS; 1 academic year)

This master's program prepares students for the production of knowledge that is critical of an alternative to hegemonic development models. It considers the problems of society from one of the consequences of globalization: the globalization of risk.

The program combines teaching and learning of both classic methodologies for transformative social action and new social research techniques, with special emphasis on audiovisual and virtual production. It is also committed to the potential of knowledge for the transformation of knowledge itself and the society that generates it.

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EQUALITY AND GENDER IN THE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SPHERES

(60 ECTS; 1 academic year)

The application of the Spanish Organic Law for Women's and Men's Equality has expanded the professional domain in which public and private organizations require highly qualified personnel to develop, implement, evaluate, and communicate equality actions.

The Master's in Equality and Gender in the Public and Private Spheres offers a comprehensive graduate training program designed by specialized teaching and research teams at the Universitat Jaume I and the Miguel Hernández University of Elche, in collaboration with the University of Alacant and the Isonomia Foundation.

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CRIMINOLOGICAL AND VICTIMOLOGICAL INTERVENTION (60 ECTS; 1 academic year)

This is the first graduate-level program in criminology that comprehensively trains professionals in the fields of criminology and criminal justice, intervention and treatment with victims and offenders, and crime prevention. It offers a highly qualified faculty, in addition to professional psychologists, criminologists, and jurists with extensive experience.

Crime, its consequences, and everything surrounding it are issues of great personal, social, economic, and political significance. One of its characteristics is that the problems associated with this phenomenon are always changing, as well as the strategies for confronting it.

Consequently, from an academic and social point of view, the need for advanced training in this area is fully justified. The Master's in Criminological and Victimological Intervention provides students with the skills needed to assess and intervene on individual and social levels, promoting and improving prevention aspects related to crime, delinquency, and victimization.

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
